

P.E. Kit Expectations

Dear families,

Firstly, I would like to thank the majority of families for sending their children to school in the correct uniform and P.E. kit. They look really smart and are certainly wearing their school colours with pride!

There are however a small minority of children who are still not wearing the correct P.E. kit, and some children are still coming to school in their P.E. kit rather than their uniform.

P.E. Kit Reminder

Below I share with you our P.E. kit expectations lifted directly from our Uniform Policy. This has been shared with all families previously and is also available on the uniform page of our school website.

P.E Kit from September 2022
White or light grey plain t-shirt
White or light grey polo top
Black shorts
Black tracksuit bottoms/joggers
Black or grey hoodie with SKA logo
Plain black or grey hoodie (no logos)
Plain black or grey sweatshirt (no logos)
Trainers for outdoor P.E.
Black indoor plimsoles/pumps for indoor P.E.

Children should not be wearing football tops, or t-shirts/hoodies/jumpers with large logos/writing on them.

Getting Changed at School

This has been a huge success across the whole of school. Children have adapted very quickly to getting changed at the beginning and end of their P.E. afternoon in separate boy and girl classrooms. They have dealt with the change sensibly and understand the reason why we are no longer allowing them to come to school in their P.E. kits. We are teaching our children to be independent and resilient learners, which is particularly important for our Year 5 and 6 children who are nearing the move to high-school.

Unless it is a specific non-uniform day or your child's class has won the attendance award, your child should be coming to school in their full school uniform with their P.E. kit in a bag to hang in the cloakroom.

As of next week, we will call the parents/carers of any children who come to school wearing their P.E. kit and will ask them to bring their child's uniform to school.
